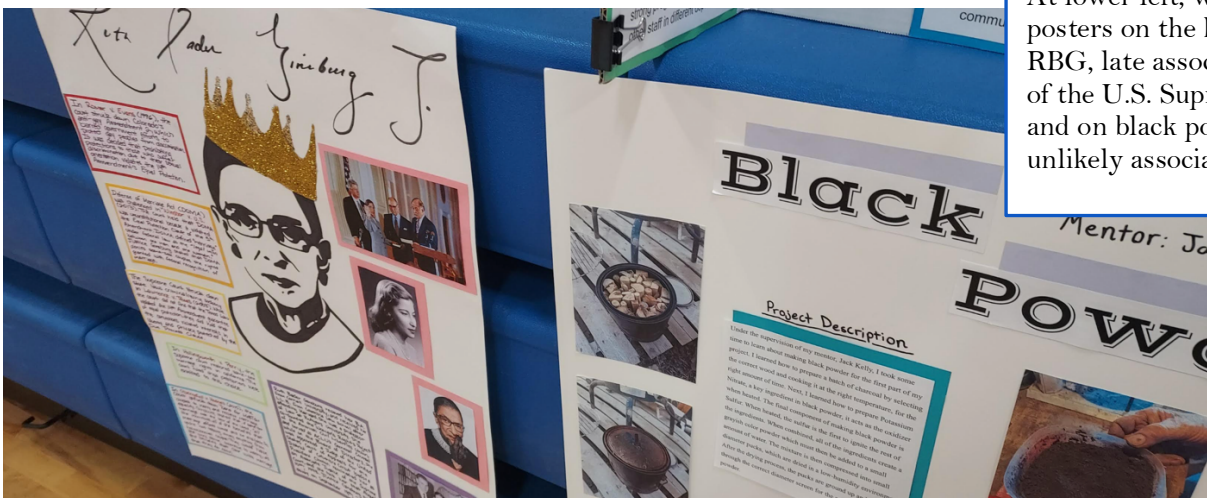
Last Wednesday's Camas School Academic Fair!

School Bond Election May 21!!!

The Camas County School Board, after years of planning and discussion and meetings with engineers and architects, is now asking Camas voters, on May 21, to approve a bond measure for an extensive facility improvement and expansion investment. The project would deliver repairs and upgrades – new roofing and HVAC systems – and expand the school eastward to deliver additional classrooms and workrooms, and a new ag/technical addition to support future ag/technical career education. The school has presented the plan to the public in a number of public information meetings in 2023 and 2024.

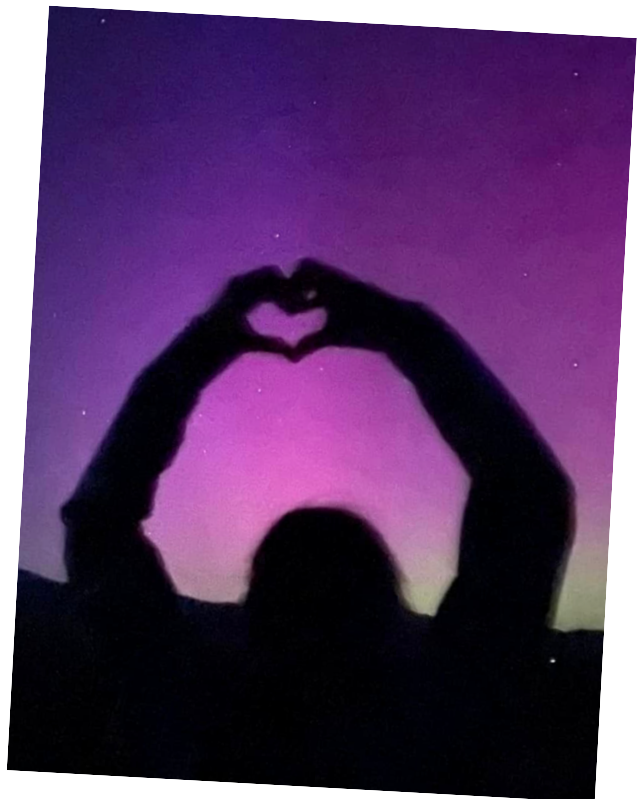
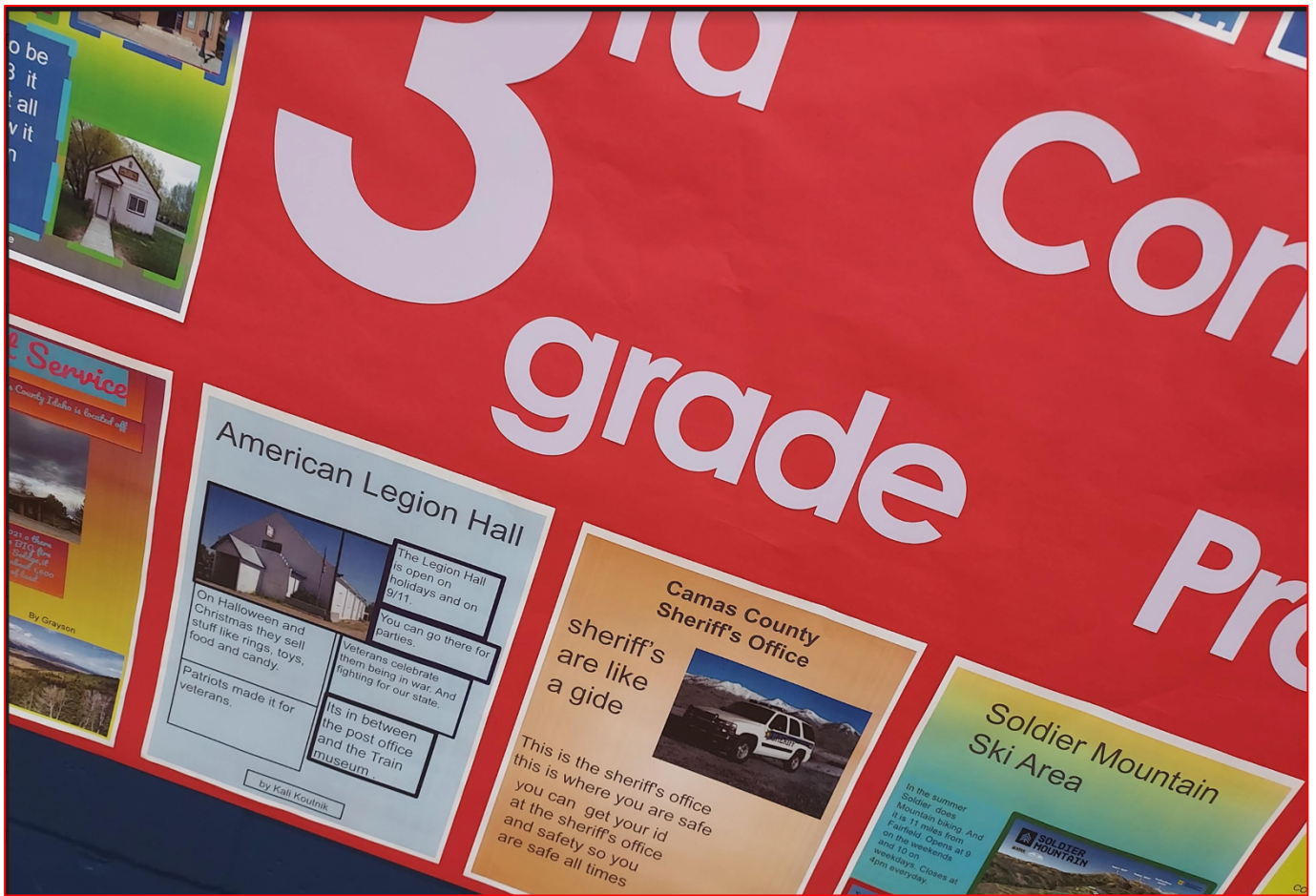
