

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING FOR CAMAS COUNTY ZONING ORDINANCE

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN: on Tuesday, the 4th day of October, 2016 at 7:15 p.m. or as soon thereafter as the matter may be heard, the Planning and Zoning Commission of Camas County will hold a public hearing at the Camas County Annex, 517 Soldier Road, Fairfield, Idaho, to consider the draft of a new Zoning Ordinance, in accordance with Section 67-6509 and 67-6511, Idaho Code. The purpose of this hearing is for the public as well as the Planning and Zoning Commission to consider the draft of a new Zoning Ordinance for Camas County and make a recommendation concerning the draft to the Camas County Board of Commissioners. A copy of the draft document is available at the Camas County Planning and Zoning Office.
