Meet! Our young women and men competed extremely well at the State Championship Meet composed of all 1A through 5A schools. Even with no classification splits, almost every Camas athlete who participated

finished in the top six in at least one of his or her qualifying events. As a result, most everyone medaled and brought home hardware. Way to finish off the year!

Field events were first on this sunny day. Gabby, Acelyn and Lilli were all up to throw the discus. However, their day started off with a crazy accident and Acelyn was hit in the head by a disc. She was off to the hospital for stitches and a check for concussion, but this didn't stop her -- she was back to the meet in time to throw.

The rush to the hospital help build her adrenalin and she threw a personal record of 71 feet 7 inches. Acelyn got

to grace the podium with a fifth place medal. Way to be tough, Acelyn, and fight through! Lilli and Gabby also did a great job in the discus, supported their teammate and pulled it together to do their best as well. Gabby took 13th and Lilli took 17th with a personal best as well.

In the meantime, Alyssa was over in the girls' long jump pit jumping a personal best of 13' 8 1/4". Trevor Tews was working his magic in the long and triple jump pit and Kaidin Baxter was working the shot put pit. Trevor

Tews scored a personal best in both the long and triple jump events. In the long jump he took fourth with a 12'10 3/4" jump and in the triple jump he took fifth with a 27'6" jump. Kaidin took 13th in the shot put and threw 32'8". Great job, Trevor and Kaidin!


Pretty soon it was time to switch it up and Ashly Botz took to the triple jump pit and Kylee Whittle was up to throw the shot put. Kaidin moved over to the discus and Allison and Naomi were up at the high jump pit.

It was a crazy time --the weather was nice and the Camas athletes were showing their stuff all over the track.

Ashly jumped a 27' even in the triple. Kylee Whittle stepped up to the competition and came home with a beautiful 4th place finish throwing a personal record of 23'. Awesome job, Kylee, beautiful form!

Kaidin did a great job in the discus throwing 82'10". Naomi and Alyssa fought some tough competition in the high jump. Naomi jumped 4'4" to take 8th and Alyssa fought through her nerves to take 3rd, jumping 4'8". Way to go, you two! You have improved so much in such a small amount of time.

Naomi had to change gears quickly and head over to the 400, where Lilli and she would be running the first running event of the day for Camas.

Both girls scored personal best times. Naomi came in 8th with a time of 1:07:82 and Lilli came in 16th with a time of 1:11:85. Beautiful run, girls!

Ashly would be stepping on the track next to run the first ever 1200-meter steeplechase in Camas Junior High history. It was an exciting race. She ran with the pack to start but then made her move over the 7th steeple, passing the lead competitor. She then pushed into the water steeple with a clean jump and moved out in front.



Ashly pushed it to the finish to come in first and to take the state record, our school record, and to be the first to run the 1,200 meter steeplechase run with a time of 4:58:29! Way to go Ashly!

However, the excitement was not over! Gabby and Acelyn were finishing their day in the shot put pit. Acelyn


threw 20'5" and Gabby threw 25'10" to take third! Alyssa, Lilli, Ashly and Naomi would be stepping on the track to do another first-time event for Camas Junior High. The 4x400 was the last race of the day and a nice evening thunderstorm rolled in. It was raining buckets and the weather had turned cold. But our racers stuck it out, purple skin and goosebumps, and took 6th with a time of 4:56:87 -- another new school record for Camas Junior High.
